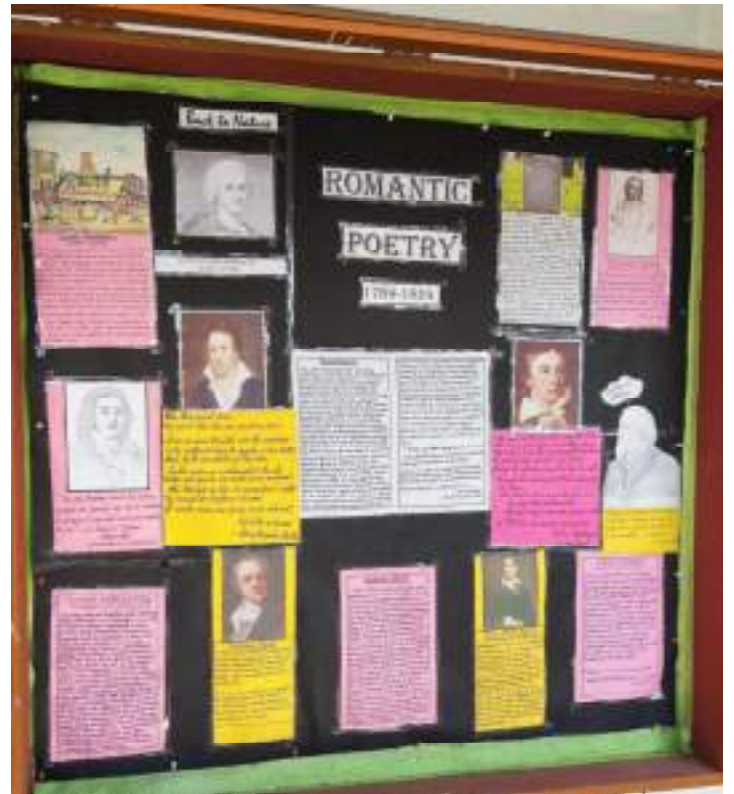

Strength behind the visit

Honorable Principal Dr. Pratap Banerjee has approved the industrial visit and encouraged the committee for organizing similar kind of activities for the benefit of students. Alumni association recently organized a meeting, at that time many ex students from the college has suggested that students should visit the industries to experience the actual working environment and the processes. H.O.D of Commerce Professor Sukumar Dan has also suggested the industrial visit for the Commerce students which will be helpful to face the interviews. . Professor Sukumar Dan has taken continuous follow-up with Kesoram Rayon management to organize this Industrial visit. Dr. Subham Dastidar, Dr. Namrota Saha, Professor Somshuddha Marick has encourage the students to participate in the Industrial Visit. All the faculty members of the college, all the teaching and non-teaching staff, and student volunteers have supported this tour.

Ground report

According to the route and time plan, we reached the Kesoram Rayon at 10:00 am. The Security officer welcomed us and guided us to the seminar room. Students were divided into two batches. The seminar room was very sophisticated where tea and biscuits were served for the students during the lecture. The PPT presentation was very informative with the introduction of the company profile and principles. The important processes of the manufacturing of Rayon Chemical & Transparent paper were explained. They cover each and every small aspect of the manufacturing process. Many students have asked queries and the instructor has solved them very cleverly and politely. Both batches moved for the plant visit where the Security Officer guided all the students about the security aspect and provided helmets and aprons. He started with the Transparent paper plant where he explained all the equipment and procedures used in the process. Also, he explained the strict regulations followed, required chemicals used in the process. After that, the batch was moved for the actual Rayon making machines; all the machines were automatic and with high efficiency. All the students have seen and understood the entire process. After the production unit, they explained the guideline of the storehouse and important symbols on the stored materials. He also gave a demo of how to load and unload the stacks of materials by using an automated cart. All the students were gathered at the seminar room for the departure, where Mr. Surendra Roy, in-charge of the wages department, explained to the students how statutory and non-statutory benefits provided by the company to the worker, and explained the detailed calculation of that, which was really beneficial for commerce students.

Mr. Surendra Roy, an official of the personnel department, delivered his speech on different amenities for employees of the Kesoram Rayon, such as salary structure, EPF, ESI, Bonus, etc.

HR Head Mr. Dutta delivered a motivational address to students and shared his experience of how the industry is coping up with the challenges of rapid technological changes as a result of globalization. He explained how they are diversifying their products through R&D to sustain in the market, which was very inspiring for the students to develop mental strength to face any odds in their personal and professional life. Moreover, he explained how the industry is dealing with hazardous chemical waste arising as a byproduct of the manufacturing process. He explained how they are taking water from the river Ganges as a raw material for production and discharge the excess to the river Ganges after treating and purifying it as per international guideline. This lecture helps students to understand how we are dependent on our mother nature and our duty to protect the nature for our

very existence. The concept of corporate social responsibility is also explained in a simple and lucid manner by him. He has explained how the company has become the backbone of economic development for the entire region either actively or passively. This portion of his speech helps students to understand the impact of industrialization to the entire society practically.

Finally Mr Dutta took a group photo with students and the entire faculty and promised to continue this activity every year for the benefit of the students.

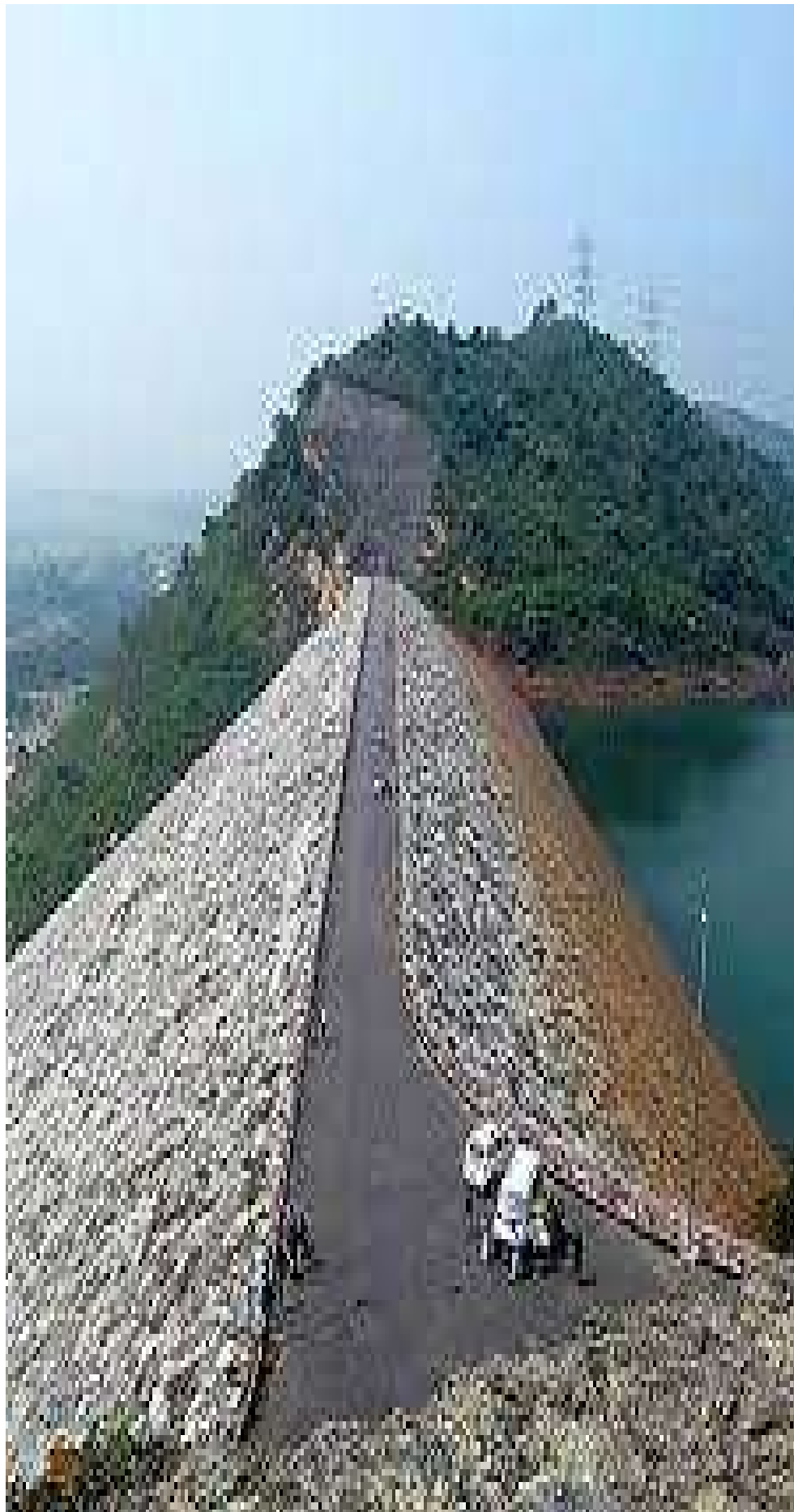

Purpose of the tour

1. To visit the second biggest earthen dam in Asia. (11 km. long)
2. To visit confluent of river Kangsabati and Kumari
3. To enjoy the natural beauty of deep blue lake created by the dam, nestled among thickly forested hillocks,
4. To know the historical and economic importance of the dam.

Structure of the tour

We started our journey at 11 p.m. on 27/12/2022, with Traveler Bus Service and reached at 4.25 a.m. on 28/12/2022, at the location. First, we refreshed ourselves and take tea and snacks from a local tea stall. After that all students along teacher went to the site, to watch the sunrise from over the dam. The guiding teacher, Dalia Hossain explain the historical and economic importance of construction of the dam. Kngsabati Reservoir Project was started in the year 1956-57 under 2nd. Five Year Plan. The then chief minister of West Bengal was Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. Till date an irrigation potential of 3,48,477 ha. has been created in the districts of Bankura, Midnapore and Hooghly through this Project.

With bank assistance and under Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme, the Government has undertaken large extension and improvement programme of the main canals. The project though originally planned for Kharif and limited Rabi, at present the irrigation water is provided for Boro cultivation also to an area of 27,944 ha.

Back to Jirat at 9.30 p.m. on 28/12/2022

Outcome of the programme

1. Students got some knowledge outside their classroom.
2. They enjoyed the whole day by bathing and boating in the lake and saw the associate tourist spots including dear park.
3. They had gained factual knowledge about the Kangsabati dam.
