<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are many Inter-disciplinary approaches in programmes of the CBCS curriculum prepared by the University of Burdwan and followed by the College. Every student in a 3 year undergraduate Honours degree course is required to study two General Elective courses in allied subjects apart from the Honours subject. Additionally, Students are required to study Environmental studies, English and Bengali mandatorily. Besides there are interdisciplinary approaches in the syllabus of various programmes: The Bengali Honours programme includes history and aspects of English Literature; English honours includes various texts from Sanskrit literature; Sanskrit Honours course integrates knowledge of World literature; English Honours and general & Political Science Honours include courses on women's studies and gender studies; the History honours programme includes courses on archaeology and museology; the B.Com Honours and General programme includes Economics and Mathematics requiring the cooperation of all three departments in taking classes. The College organises Advanced Learner Seminars where students of all programmes participate. These seminars are organized with the sole aim of 	

providing the students with a multidisciplinary orientation.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

- Balagarh Bijoy Krishna Mahavidyalaya had been encouraging and creating awareness among students about ABC Id since the previous year. This year we had corresponded with the University of Burdwan on the issue and informed them of our readiness to accept the concept of Academic Bank of Credits. Our College is situated in a rural area and every year a few students leave the College at various stages due to financial reasons. Academic Bank of credits would provide them with an opportunity to pursue academics at a later stage from any institution of their choice.
- This academic year we also planned and succeeded in executing an outreach programme of creating awareness about NEP in the schools of the neighbouring areas of Jirat, Balagarh, Somra and so on. Separate teams from the College visited 11 schools to spread awareness about NEP and Academic Bank of Credits.
- ABC Id was created by the College for all the students of 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters. Students were notified that creation of ABC Id was mandatory. Special drives were organised on 10th, 11th and 27th of June 2023 in the college campus. ABC id of a total of 1553 students were created in these three days. A few Ids could not be created due to technical issues. A list of such students and their data was sent to the University of Burdwan so that action could be taken at their end.

17. Skill development:

- Diploma in Pre-Primary Teachers' Education - Montessori course affiliated by Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) is conducted by the College.
- Certificate Course in Yoga affiliated by the University of Burdwan is also conducted by the College
- The CBCS curriculum followed by the College includes Skill Enhancement Courses. The Honours programme and General programme students are required to study 2 and 4 such courses respectively.
- B.Com Honours course : E-Commerce and Entrepreneurship; B.Com General course: E-Commerce and Entrepreneurship; Computer Application in Business and Personal Selling and Salesmanship; B.Sc Chemistry Honours: IT Skill in chemistry or basic analytical chemistry; Pharmaceutical chemistry; B.Sc Chemistry General: Analytical clinical biochemistry; Pharmaceutical

chemistry. Basic and applications of computer in chemistry; polymer chemistry; B.Sc. Mathematics Hons: Logic and Sets; Graph Theory; B.Sc Physics General: Weather Forecasting; Computational Physics Skills; Electrical Circuits and Network Skills; Renewable Energy and Energy Harvesting; B.A. English Honours: Translation studies; English Language Teaching B.A. History Hons: Archives and Museums in India; Art Appreciation B.A. Political Science Honours: Legislative Support; Democratic Awareness through Legal Literacy

- The dept. of English organises Spoken English programme. This Academic year the Spoken English Course was started in the month of June
- Some skill development programmes are organised by the Career Counselling cell or NSS occasionally.

- The College offers Bengali Honours and General programme which attracts a huge number of students.
- Many classes are taught in Indian Language (Bengali) in all Honours and General courses.
- The CBCS curriculum followed by the College integrates aspects of Indian language and Culture. For eg. The Bengali and English Honours programme includes aspects and texts of Sanskrit Literature.
- The Sanskrit Hons and General course completely focuses on Sanskrit Literature, Sanskrit Grammar, Indian Ontology and epistemology etc.
- B.A History Honours course includes a course on Indian Art apart from an extensive coverage of the History of India B.A. Political Science includes a course on Indian Political Thought

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

- Programme outcomes and course outcomes of the various courses available in the College are outlined by the teachers and discussed in class.
- The Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes are made available in the College Website so that it can be viewed by all stakeholders
- Student progression to higher education is monitored by all departments.
- The course objectives are communicated to students through various means such as college prospectus, Principal's address to students and parents.

- Students are made aware of the course specific outcomes through orientation programme and classroom discussion
- Teachers are deputed to attend meetings for framing syllabus, workshops, seminars, conferences and FDPs to enrich their understanding of course objectives and outcomes.
- A Job oriented course Diploma in Pre-Primary Teachers' Education - Montessori (1year) affiliated by NSOU is conducted by the College.

20.Distance education/online education:

- The college encourages online learning and distance learning and has undertaken various initiatives to provide such opportunities to students despite the fact that the College is situated in a rural area where internet connectivity is poor and many students belong to the underprivileged classes and are unable to afford smartphones.
- The College has a study centre of Netaji Subhas Open University which facilitates distance education in the area. The students passing out from the College as well students of adjoining Colleges can pursue higher education in different courses from NSOU through this study centre. The centre distributes learning materials, organises examination related activities, and facilitates students in academics in various ways.
- Online seminars were organised by the college in the academic year 2022-23 in which teachers and students from our College and other Colleges participated. This endeavour of the College made students accustomed to online learning.
- An ICT awareness programme was organised by the IQAC on 4th January 2023 to make the students aware about e-resources and online learning platforms like SWAYAM, NPTEL, epg Pathsala. Subsequently many departments organized separate programmes to enroll departmental students for online learning

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The CBCS system has been implemented by the College since the 2017-18 session along with semester system of examination. At the beginning of every semester the various departments prepare a Teaching Plan including the portion of syllabus and the number of classes allotted to each teacher so that curriculum delivery could be effectively managed. Apart from lecturing, some innovative practices are implemented like using power point presentations, documentaries or movies so that the learner can not only enjoy but also take an active interest in classes. Internal Assessment tests are conducted according to the University guidelines. Assignments are provided to students and class tests are regularly held to evaluate the progress of the students. Students' performance in these tests is discussed by teachers in class. Besides, class seminars are conducted in some departments in order to make students more confident with their academic as well as public speaking abilities. For subjects like Chemistry, Physics and Geography Practical classes are provided according to the

requirement of the syllabus. The college occasionally arranges educational tour of some departments with the help of faculty members where the students are actively involved and gain experience. These tours help students to enrich their knowledge of their concerned subjects and contribute to experiential learning.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The College adheres to the academic calendar prepared following the academic calendar of the University. The internal assessments are normally held after the 8th week of the semester but may vary depending upon the Time schedule of Semester end examinations of the University of Burdwan. This academic year the Internal Assessment examinations of Semesters 1, 3 & 5 were held in November and December 2022, Semester 4 and 6 were held in the month of May 2023 respectively. The Internal Assessment carries 15 marks out of which 5 marks is the attendance component. The evaluation of 10 marks is carried out in the form of test, which comprises short answer type and long answer type questions following the question pattern of the University. Sometimes students are assigned seminar paper or project submission as Internal Assessment on a specified topic to evaluate in depth understanding and ability of explication. Practical exams are held in B.Sc programmes as well as in Geography and Physical Education.

The College authority and IQAC encourages teachers to use ICT equipment in classes to make powerpoint presentations, show resources from internet, documentaries or movies in order to involvestudents. the college has seven ICT equipped class rooms viz. A1, A6, B1, B3, B4B, S5, Computer Lab. All the rooms have projectors and screens. Three rooms are equipped with desktops and in the rest four roomsprojectors are attached to laptops. All the rooms in the ground and first floor have internet access throug WIFI. Students also present papers in student seminars using power-point.

There are two internet service producers(ISP) who provide internet connection to the college: Alliance BroadbandProvides 250mbps bandwidth internet connection and GPL Broadband which also provides 250mbps bandwidth internet connection. Therefore total of 500 mbps bandwidth is available for teaching learning activity.

School for Migrant Workers by NSS

NSS Units of Balagarh Bijoy Krishna Mahavidyalaya under the leadership of NSS Programme Officer Prof. Partha Chattopadhyay has created a school for the children of migrant labourers "Bhupati Majumder Pathsala" named after Bhupati Majumder, a Freedom fighter at Jirat and Guptipara. NSS volunteers visit these children and teach them rudimentary and basic knowledge of Languages, History, Geography, Mathematics. Besides Yoga is also taught to these Children. NSS volunteers also engage these children in cultural activities. The parents of these children are encouraged to send these children to a proper school.

The NSS in collaboration with the Local administration (BDO) and Jirat Colony School has been able to send these children to Primary Schools.

In the Academic Years 2021-22 and 2022-23 about 886 children of Migrant labourers working in 8 brick kilns of the surrounding villages have been admitted in 8 Primary schools situated near their location.
